Georges River Presbytery News

From the Mission and Leadership Presbytery Minister

As we come to the final quarter of the year, we begin to feel the excitement of a new season. Spring and new growth are signs that God is at work. For over two years our congregations have experienced gloom and hardship living through the pandemic, mourning our damaged ecclesial orthodoxy and a reality of depleted membership and capacity. How can we help our congregations and committees adjust to new ways of being church amidst the shifting social patterns of the communities around us? How can we grow in this new season of postmodernity? I am reminded of our vision statement: "Georges River Presbytery exists to see healthy growing congregations within the Presbytery who will be known for passionately pursuing the mission of Jesus." I am also reminded that, despite trying circumstances, God is at work and we are to join the Lord in God's lifegiving mission.

Winter is gone and we are in a new season. On August 27th representatives from congregations attended a GRP half-day mission retreat held at Kogarah Uniting Church. The program included a brief progress report on the GRP Mission and Vision Strategic Plan, a self-identification exercise on the 4 types of church categories and mapping our presbytery into geographical areas. The focus on the day was 'collaboration' – a strategic core value of the GRP plan.

The takeaways observed on the day were the number of participants who attended and engaged in the retreat, the excitement and passion in their regional group discussion and sharing, and the optimism and hope that grew out of the retreat. Participants broke into groups from the four regions (Sutherland Shire, Canterbury-Bankstown, Bayview, and Georges River) and shared the challenges and their missional aspirations with the rest of the participants. Many are still talking about the joys and hope conjured up on the day. Thank you, Kogarah Uniting Church, for hosting the event and for the generous hospitality.

This excitement has translated to those regional clusters ongoing engagement since. For instance, the Bayview group of churches had continued meeting and culminated in a gathering last Saturday, 1st October, at Bardwell Park Uniting Church where they shared their mission over a fellowship and a meal. The Bayview Mission group involves Bardwell Park Uniting Church, Carlton Ramsgate Uniting Church, Rockdale Uniting Church, Bexley Uniting Church, Kogarah Uniting Church and St. Andrew's Brighton-Le-Sands Uniting Church. Hurstville City Uniting Church were also invited to share with the group. Other regional clusters are encouraged to continue the conversations and report back to the next Presbytery meeting in November.

What a fabulous night of worship and fellowship at Bankstown Uniting Church on Friday 30th September. The Presbytery event was organised by LSiC and led by Bankstown youth leader Benji Asomaning and his team. It was an amazing evening of praise and worship highlighted by the very





talented young people. Over 140 young people and some senior members attended the worship service. Presbytery would like to thank Bankstown Youth, New Beginnings, Bankstown Church on the Highway Youth, Campsie-Earlwood-Clemton Park Youth, Hurstville's Real Force, and Carlton Ramsgate's Glee for a wonderful praise and worship connecting us to God through songs and dances. Very grateful also to Menai-Illawong, St Andrews Brighton and other congregation members for joining the praise and worship evening. Following a successful night of worship and fellowship many young people are asking about the next event. A very special acknowledgment to Rev Gaby and Bankstown District UC for your open arms and hospitality.

Finally, please remember that you are not alone. We all belong to the Body of Christ, we are one (1 Corinthians 12:27). When one part of the body hurts the whole body experience the pain. Growing pains are part of life and we are to endure times of struggle. I pray that Spring will mark a season of new growth for us and that we will endure even when we face challenges of change in coming months. To God be the glory.

Rev Steve Aynsley commencing February 2023

The GRP Joint Nominating Committee is pleased to announce to all congregation members that this fulltime Ministry position will be commencing in February 2023.

Our presbytery is thrilled to have Rev Steve Aynsley as part of the Team at 18 The Avenue Hurstville. His experience, skills and many personal attributes make him an ideal Minster for this Pastoral Relations role.

Two areas of competence in the Position Description are:

Maturity in personality and faith in Jesus Christ with a clear set of values consistent with the Uniting Church as expressed in the Basis of Union:

Steve has had been in ministry for 27 years. He has a deep faith in Jesus Christ. He has a clear and extensive knowledge of the Uniting Church having been Chairperson of the Sydney Central Coast Presbytery PRC for many years. In his own words he states, "I am broad in my theology, growing more progressive from an early conservative faith as an Anglican."

An explicit sense of hope for the future of the Uniting Church:

Steve has a steadfast hope that the UC will flourish but perhaps not in the same form as it is at the moment. He amalgamated Gordon & Pymble Uniting Churches into one church recently, he has experience with Governance and management responsibilities from his work on a School Board and others have described him as having a "capacity for a high level of strategic planning" which is a competency needed to assist with the implementation of GRP's Mission Vision & Strategic Plan.

Steve has been in Congregational roles for all his ministry (in Griffith, the Blue Mountains and Gordon-Pymble) and also brings a wealth of knowledge due to his Pastoral Relations Committee (PRC) experience.

Just a small quote from Steve's profile fills us with hope as he takes up his new Ministry with Georges River Presbytery in 2023.

"I love relating to the variety of people who connect with congregations, such as welcoming those new to exploring faith at Tuesday Conversations at GPUC, establishing a Café-based group for alternative types in the Blue Mountains, and including and incorporating Pacific Islanders at Griffith."

He is highly regarded by many people in the Uniting Church as "a great guy" and his warm approachable manner was experienced by the JNC.




