Notes from the Mission and Leadership Presbytery Minister

"Georges River Presbytery exists to see healthy growing congregations within the Presbytery who will be known for passionately pursuing the mission of Jesus." (GRP vision statement)

We welcome our new staff members to the office: Rev Steve Aynsley (Pastoral Relations Presbytery Minister) and Cassandra Eccleston (Emerging Gen Leader). After two years of looking, we have finally inducted Steve to the position of PR Minister. Steve brings vast experience, wisdom, and fresh ideas to our Presbytery.

Cassy is a Presbytery appointed Emerging Generation leader based in Rockdale Uniting Church. Part of her role is to assist Living Streams in Christ (LSiC), lead and build a cohort of young leaders in our

Presbytery. Her work is central to our Presbytery's vision of 'growing young' and 'intercultural'. It also aligns with NSWACT Synod's future direction priorities of growing in numbers, discipleship, relationships, and impact.

Cassy was commissioned together with two other Emerging Gen workers, Benjie Asomaning and Jane Guizhen Su, both based in Canterbury Bankstown UC. Both are part time positions working together with young people; Jane engaging students at a new Western Sydney University campus in Bankstown, and Benjie is continuing his youth ministry but assisting other emerging Gen ministries around the Canterbury-Bankstown zone.

One of the core values of our MVSP is 'collaboration'. Our Presbytery is supporting congregations within their geographical zones to meet, share and collaborate in God's mission. Some zones are working well meeting with regular informal meetings, shared events, etcetera, others are still in their early stages. I encourage ministers and leaders to reach out to one another and share in conversations about how best to work together and support one another's ministries. Contact me for more information on congregations and zone collaborations.

After a slow start for the year Living Streams in Christ (LSiC) are looking to pick up the momentum with the support of the new Emerging Gen Leader and cohort. Strategies around structures and priorities are being explored. We encourage our congregations to pray and support the young people in our Presbytery.

A great example is a collaboration between youth leaders and mentors of Brighton Le-sands, Carlton-Ramsgate, and Hurstville City. Out of their engagement 'Ignite' was initiated, a joint rotating evening worship services targeting youth and young adults, but also open to all ages. Their first two 'Ignite' events this year were very successful. The third is planned for April, to be hosted by Hurstville City UC.

Equipping local lay leaders for mission is also a priority for our Presbytery. Our mission, vision, and strategic plan (MVSP) outlined its 2020 – 2025 missional priorities. One of the priorities is building 'a culture of leadership and leadership development that seeks to provide best practice in our partnership in God's mission.' Training and mentoring programs across Presbytery and within congregations is essential to achieving our missional aspirations outlined in the MVSP. Moreover, with many of our current Ministers on part time placements and those who are on 100% scaling down due to financial struggles, we are to intentionally develop a missional strategy to train and build capacity of every member beginning with lay leaders. This strategy aims to identify, invite, and develop new leaders while refreshing and redevelop capacity of the current ones.

As part of this core commitment, we look to host our first Mission Possible Presbytery gathering on the 22nd of April on Lay Leadership Ministry but with a special focus on worship leading and preaching. It will take place at Jannali UC, 9.30am to 12noon.

I encourage lay leaders, current and potential worship leaders to attend the gathering. Intentionally seek out young adults and encourage them to join the journey.

A message from the Georges River Presbytery Pastoral Relations Presbytery Minister

'Can these bones live?'

This week, the lectionary provides the well-known story of the valley of dry bones, and Ezekiel's role in speaking God's Word to bring new life. (Ezekiel 37: 1-14)

The vivid imagery of dry bones – and "very many" of them – is a confronting one. It is not just that the bodies have died; but that decay, decomposition and scorching sun have all had their way, leaving only dry skeletons. Whatever life the bones represent, it was a long-time ago.

Was this how the people of Israel felt whilst in exile? Did they feel cut off and completely dead to their identity, which was so closely tied to their homeland? Perhaps the dry bones represented not only that Israel had been defeated militarily and the population moved against their will, but all the impossible steps that would be required to undo that national disaster.

As leaders and members of our congregations across the Presbytery, where might we find ourselves in this story?

- We can be like Ezekiel at the beginning of the vision, feeling overwhelmed as we are confronted by death. The Church faces nothing of the desolation that those exiles experienced, but it certainly is a time of struggle and decline for many congregations. However, we should not condemn ourselves as if this is something unique to the church. Similar decline is being experienced across political parties, unions, service and sporting clubs and almost any organisation based on formal membership. We are in the midst of a profound societal shift that perhaps only occurs every 500 years¹. A successful response will not involve blame on how we got here or who has failed, but an honest engagement with the new present in which we find ourselves and an openness to a fresh future.
- Perhaps, like Ezekiel, we hear whispers of new life as we entertain the question "Can these bones live?" Maybe we look at our out-of-date buildings, our battered budgets and even our tired people and begin to see what's possible rather than decry once more what we can no longer do. Maybe we put to death grand hopes of returning to a former glory and instead embrace a more modest, but faithful future. Maybe we imagine what could come to life if we engaged with our church neighbours and worked together rather than in competition. As I picture the scene Ezekiel describes, I imagine the Lord's question pulling up Ezekiel with a jolt. New possibility floods his soul. Perhaps an alternate future is possible? Such holy wondering is the genesis of new life.

 Or maybe, with Ezekiel, we are finding ourselves proclaiming new life; talking to bones, as it were. We may not understand it all. We may not quite know where it is all heading, or what the future will look like exactly, but we are stepping out in faith, trusting that God knows what God is doing. And yes, we may play a role in rearranging the bones of property-use or even adding some sinews by developing a mission plan, but we know that true life only comes from the Spirit of God.

You may find other points of connection in this strange and confronting story, but surely the purpose of this text is to help us know that at times of death – in all its forms – the Lord of life is acting to revive and restore the people of God, according to the divine purposes and plans.

May we meditate on the Lord's provocative question, "Can these bones live?"

May stories of new green shoots in the life of the church, encourage our hearts.

And may hope fill our cynical souls.

REPORT OF Bexley Uniting Church (BUC) FOOD COMMUNITY - COOKING DEMONSTRATIION SESSION

(This is the first of a monthly session that will be held every last Saturday of the month)

DATE:- 25TH FEBRUARY 2023.

TIME: 3.30 P.M. FOR 4.00 P.M. - 6.00 P.M.

PROGRAM:

- 1) ADOBO CHICKEN ROLANDO PEREYRA aka ROLLY
 - Staple Filipino dish.

Ingredients: chicken, bay leaves, pepper, garlic, dark soy sauce, coconut vinegar or cane vinegar, lemon (optional) adds a little citrusy flavour.

Marinate chicken with soy sauce and garlic (2 hours or longer), infuse oil with garlic on a hot pan, and lightly brown chicken. Mix all the ingredients together with marinade sauce. Put the vinegar last (1/2 cup)

Use any chicken part when cooking this dish. The common parts that I use are thigh, drumstick and breast

Dark soy sauce is common, but you may use any kind of soy sauce. Coconut aminos will also work, so is white vinegar. Garlic adds to the flavour, use as many as you prefer. Chili flakes, fresh chilli or chilli oil to taste.

Transfer chicken into a pot. Add the sauces: coconut vinegar, soya sauce, pepper, salt and a little chilli powder (optional)

Stew for half an hour and serve.

2) VEGETARIAN DOLMA – VIAN KHAMIS

Assyrian favourite

Ingredients: 1 jar Grape Vine leaves, ½ cup Basmati long grain rice, ½ cup dry parsley, 3 tablespoons tomato paste, ¼ cup light olive oil, 1 tablespoon chilli powder, 1 teaspoon salt, ½ teaspoon black pepper, 2 small eggplants, 2 capsicums, 2 hot peppers, 2 onion, 2 tomatoes, 1 large eggplant

Juice ingredients: ¼ cup light olive oil, 3 tablespoons tomato paste, 1 teaspoon citric acid, 1 teaspoon salt, 4 cups boiling water.

Soak the rice in water for ½ an hour, soak vine leaves in warm water to remove the vinegar, heat olive oil in a saucepan until hot; slice the eggplant and lay at the bottom of a large pot; dice the onion and eggplant; scoop the insides of the tomatoes, dice and place in the mixture; scoop the peppers & eggplants and remove the inside; place the rice, parsley, oil, chilli powder, salt, black pepper, tomato paste and mix together; place a teaspoon of the mixture on a vine leaf and close; place all the vine leaves and vegetables in a pot, mix all the juice ingredients together and pour on the dolma; place on high heat for 10-15 minutes then simmer on low for 1 hour. Ready to serve.

- 3) MANGO PUDDING MELODY (TABLETENNIS GROUP) Ingredient: Aeroplane mango pudding mix (2 boxes), light carnation milk, 2 mangoes cut into small cubes. Boil hot water (250gm), add to mango pudding mix, stir until cool, then add 250gm cold water, stirring all the time. Then add mango cubes, stir, add carnation milk and stir. Pour into jelly mould and cool in fridge for a couple of hours.
- 4) VEGETARIAN KOREAN PANCAKE NANCY (PYOUNGGANG GROUP) Ingredients: vegetables sliced – carrot, cabbage, capsicum, zucchini, plain flour. Add water with flour to form thick mixture, add vegetables. Fry pancake mix in frying pan, serve when brown.

It was a most successful activity and with about 30 participants. After the demonstrations, everybody joined in the food tasting.






