REFLECTION - Deok Hee

"Emboldened to Proclaim"

Acts 7:55-60, John 14:1-14

If you meet someone for the first time, what questions would you ask them? You're probably asking, "What's your name?" "What do you do?" "Where do you live?" etc.. We had community lunch last Friday. I joined a lady at the table, and when she saw me she asked, "What's your name?" I said Deok Hee. She asked me again how to pronounce my name. I wanted her to remember my name, so I explained her how to easily remember my name. I said my name sounds like "Donkey" "Door Key", and she called me Door Key. I don't mind. I asked back to her, "What's your name?" "Where do you live?" "Where are you from?" "How many children do you have?". You know we soon became friends. We ask those questions when we meet someone for the first time.

I would like to ask a question to you. When you heard about Jesus for the first time, what did you ask or what did you want to know about him? When I was a child, a primary school kid, I often asked my Sunday school teachers about God. "Who is God? Is he alive? Then where is he now? Is he in the sky? Have you seen him before? I want to see him.. I really want to see him." These questions are exactly what my children have asked me many times. How about you? Have you asked these questions too? Knowing and understanding is very important in our Christian life, especially who Jesus is. Without understanding about Jesus, we can't truly follow him.

Jesus is telling us who he is in our John's gospel reading chapter 14. "I am the way, the truth, and the life". There is also a song about this chapter John 14. This song was one of my favourite songs when I was a kid. "I am the way, the truth, and the life, that's what Jesus said. Without the way, there is no going; without the truth, there is no

knowing; without the life, there is no living. I am the way, the truth, and the life, that's what Jesus said." This passage from chapter 14 of John is part of a great talk that Jesus spoke to the disciples in the upper room. The end of his earthly ministry approaching, the cross looming before him, Jesus gathered his disciples around him and to help them understand his life and work, his approaching death and resurrection, he spoke to them these words, which include him saying, "I am the way and the truth and the life."

Let's together think about this this morning what it means to us living this world. Jesus begins by saying, "I am the way." When God created us, he didn't put us permanently in a set of rotating doors, like those that go around and around in the front of big buildings. Even though life may at times seem to be just going in circles, even though there are those who say that life is one cycle after another and that everything that comes around goes around, and even though there are theories about life that say that life is one reincarnation after another, Jesus does not say that. God has created us with a purpose. Life has a goal to it. We are created to travel through life toward an end. And today Jesus says the way to that end is through him. The safest, most secure, most dependable way through life is by Christ. That's why Jesus says, "I am the way."

A missionary told a story of being lost in an African jungle, and finally he came across a small village. He found a lady who could speak English, and volunteered to take him back to the missionaries' place. As they hacked their way through the jungle, the missionary asked, "Are you sure this is the right way home?" The lady said, "Sir, in this jungle there is no pathway, I am the path . . . you must follow." If we want to find our way to the place God has created for us, we must follow Christ. Because Jesus leads us to God. Because he is the way.

Now, we are not only travellers through life, we are also called to be learners, and for that reason, Jesus went on to say, "I am the truth." We are created for the truth, and seeking and living the truth is what we are called to do. However, when you think about it, it is rather ironic. While more books have been written about Jesus than about any other person who ever lived, Jesus never wrote a book. He didn't sit down and write about the truth or anything like that. In fact, there is only one instance in the gospels (in John 8), when Jesus wrote anything and that was in the dust at his feet and we have no record of what he wrote. But that's okay. Because instead of writing about the truth, Jesus lived it. His life was a witness to the truth. And the truth of his life is seen through the eyes of the blind man who now sees. The truth of his life is seen in the leper who returned to give thanks, the dancing feet of the lame made well, and the dead now raised to life. Because Jesus is truth in the flesh - truth incarnate - truth able to say, "If anyone sees me, they see the Father."

When we look at Jesus, we see the truth about God. We learn that, first and foremost, God is love. It is God's nature to love. It is God's nature to show mercy. It is God's nature to forgive and accept the outcast, welcome home the prodigal. In Christ, we see the very nature of God whose love for us is unwarranted, and most unexpected. And when we look at Jesus, we learn the truth about the life God wants us to live. We, too, are to love, to forgive, to show mercy, and welcome each other, and in doing so, be part of the truth about God. The New Testament puts it another way in 1 John 4:7, when John writes, "Dear friends, let us love one another for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God." He also says, "If anyone says, I love God, and yet hates his brother or sister, he is a liar. For anyone who does not love his brother or sister, whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen." When we look at Jesus, we also see the truth about ourselves. Maybe that's why it's so hard to look at Jesus sometimes, because when we look at Jesus, we see ourselves - the ugliness of our lives, the sinfulness of our thoughts and deeds, our selfishness and pride, and our failure to love. When Jesus says, "I am the truth," he confronts us with our failures to forgive, our refusals to show mercy, and our self-righteousness pride that puts others down. That is why it is so important that Jesus not only say, "I am the way and the truth" but also say, "I am the life." It is because without Jesus, there is no life in us. Jesus says, "I am the life. No one comes to the Father except by me." These words are Jesus' invitation to us to come to him, to receive in him the gift of life that God created for us.

In Acts 7, we have the story of Stephen. We are first introduced to Stephen in Acts 6. The disciples were preaching with such strength that their numbers were increasing daily, but those in Greek society were concerned because the widows were being neglected. So, the disciples selected seven men of good standing, full of the Spirit and wisdom, and appointed them to the task of caring for the widows. Stephen was among the seven appointed to this task. No sooner was Stephen appointed to this ministry than he was arrested. Stephen proclaimed God to the religious authorities. They didn't like the message and got angry and arrested him. They dragged him out of the city and began to stone him and he died.

I guess he was a good man, a good neighbor, a good friend, a hard worker, always ready to help. He was an ordinary man like us. Maybe a good husband... we don't know if he was married or not. But this good man was not afraid of death but preached the word of God, and was stoned and died. I asked to myself why, why he did that. He knew danger there. What made him boldly preach the word of God without fear of death? He followed Jesus, experienced Jesus, learned Jesus, and he knew and realized that Jesus was the way and the truth and the life.

"I am the way and the truth and the life." Throughout John's gospel this has been the theme. In Jesus, we have life. In fact, in the very beginning of his gospel that's what John tells us, he writes, "In the beginning was the Word ... and in him was life and the life was the light of men." And again at the end of his gospel, John says that same thing. "These things are written that you may have life in his name." That is God's promise to us. In Jesus, we have the way and the truth and the life that God creates us to be. In Jesus, we find the blessing that God has ready for us. In Jesus, we find the power for living and the essence of life itself. That's why he tells us, "I am the way and the truth and the life."

Brothers and sisters in Christ! Please remember this! If you want to find the way to the place God has created for us, you must follow Christ because Jesus leads us to God, because he is the way. If you want to experience life both now and in eternity you must follow his teachings because Jesus is the truth. If you want to grow and receive the gift of life that God created for us, you must accept Jesus' invitation to us to come to him because Jesus is the life. These are the things we should boldly share with our neighbours.
