READING FROM THE HEBREW SCRIPTURES: Genesis 22: 1-14

After these things God tested Abraham. He said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." ²He said, "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains that I shall show you."

³So Abraham rose early in the morning, saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and his son Isaac; he cut the wood for the burnt offering, and set out and went to the place in the distance that God had shown him. ⁴On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place far away. ⁵Then Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here

with the donkey; the boy and I will go over there; we will worship, and then we will come back to you." ⁶Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on his son Isaac, and he himself carried the fire and the knife. So the two of them walked on together. ⁷Isaac said to his father Abraham, "Father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." He said, "The fire and the wood are here, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" ⁸Abraham said, "God himself will provide the lamb for a burnt offering, my son." So the two of them walked on together. ⁹When they came to the place that God had shown him, Abraham built an altar there and laid the wood in order. He bound his son Isaac, and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. ¹⁰Then Abraham reached out his hand and took the knife to kill his son.

REFLECTION: "Welcoming Community"

Have you ever seen this?



Where have you seen something like this? Usually, we'd see a mat like this outside the door to our home, wouldn't we? A mat such as this usually has two purposes. Do you know what those two purposes are? Well, for one thing, it is a friendly reminder for people to wipe their shoes off so that they won't track dirt or mud into your home. And second, it is placed outside your door as a sign to let people know that they are welcome in your home. How important is it to be a welcoming church? How thankful are we for those who receive us? How do we receive each other, and newcomers? I want us to be more welcoming and a welcoming church.

Jesus says in our gospel reading in verse 42, "Whoever gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones in the name of a disciple will not lose their reward". "Hospitality". Do you know what "hospitality" is? In my dictionary, it says hospitality is the friendly reception and treatment of guests or strangers. We practice hospitality when we receive guests in our home. When visitors come to our home, it is important that we be kind to them. We want them to be comfortable, to feel at home with us. We offer them something to drink, even something to eat. Jesus wants his followers to practice hospitality, especially to "little ones." That can mean children. "Little ones" can also mean those who are left out, those who are very needy, those who are hungry and without enough food, even those who have no home. Jesus says that when we even give a cup of cold water to one of these little ones, it is like we are giving that water to Jesus. Jesus in our Gospel reading speaks of sharing even a cup of cold water which speaks to the practicality of living the Christian life. Our life with God is a life that is designed to touch others in practical ways. We must be open to sharing God's Love in Practical Ways.

I would like to test you this morning. What would you do with the following challenge? You are driving along in your car on a wild, stormy night. You pass by a bus stop, and you see three people waiting for the bus:

1. A very sick older woman who looks as if she is about to die.

2. An old friend who once saved your life.

3. The perfect man or woman (beautiful and handsome) you have been dreaming about all your life.

Which one would you choose to offer a ride, and there is only one passenger in your car. This is one of those moral/ethical dilemmas that are often used as part of a job application. One like this was on an application I once had long time ago in Korea. Which one would you choose to offer a ride? You could pick up the older woman because she is going to die, and thus you should save her first. Or you could take the old friend because he once saved your life, and this would be the perfect chance to pay them back. However, you may never be able to find your perfect dream lover again. One of my friends answered on this question like this. I love what he shared. What did he say? He simply answered: "I would give the car keys to my old friend who once saved my life, and let him take the elderly lady to the hospital. And I would stay behind and wait for the bus with the woman of my dreams." What a clever answer it is!!!

Jesus challenges his disciples and us in our Gospel reading and in many other places in the Scriptures to do the small thing to show God's Love. In John 13, the night before he dies, Jesus washes his disciples' feet and then challenges them to love others. Jesus then makes this observation in John, "Everyone will know that you are my disciples because of your love for one another." Do the small thing to show God's Love. Show God's love through the little things. The simplest of acts can have impacts far beyond our dreams. Take for example this story of a humble hotel clerk. In the city of Philadelphia USA there was a little third-class hotel. Into it one night there came two tired elderly people. They went up to the night clerk and the husband pleadingly said, "Mister, please don't tell us you don't have a room. My wife and I have been all over the city looking for a place to stay. We didn't know about the big conventions that are here. The hotels at which we usually stay are all full. We're dead tired and it's after midnight. Please, don't tell us you don't have a place where we can sleep." The clerk looked at them a long moment and then answered, "Well, I don't have a single room except my own. I work at night and sleep in the daytime. It's not as nice as the other rooms, but it's clean, and I'll be happy for you to be my guests for tonight." The wife said, "God bless you, young man." The next morning at the breakfast table, the couple sent the waiter to tell the night clerk they wanted to see him on very important business. The night clerk went in, recognized the two people, sat down at the table and said he hoped they had had a good night's sleep. They thanked him most sincerely. Then the husband surprised the worker with this statement, "You're a too good hotel man to stay in a hotel like this. How would you like for me to build a big, beautiful, luxurious hotel in the city of New York and make you general manager?" The clerk didn't know what to say. He thought there might be something wrong with their minds. He finally stammered, "It sounds wonderful." His guest then introduced himself. "I'm John Jacob Astor." So, the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel was built. Four years later, the hotel was the largest in the world and boasted extraordinary standards of service. The night clerk became the best-known hotel man in the world.

The point of this story is not that you will be rewarded for doing good deeds, but that simple deeds can produce larger results than we expect. Simple acts can show the love of God through our actions. One clerk chose to show a simple act of kindness to strangers by sharing his room with this tired couple. He touched them in ways he could not have expected. His simple act of kindness touched this couple and greatly impacted how they looked at this young man. Acts of kindness can be contagious. These extraordinary situations don't come along every day. But every day there is a situation that a simple act of kindness, a simple act becomes contagious and more people share their own love with their fellow people. Jesus wants his followers to be welcoming people, to be

kind to those who come to church, or who come to our home. Hospitality is a gift that followers of Jesus give to others because Jesus wants us to. I hope you feel welcome here at church, and I hope that you can also help to welcome others, because that is one of the ways that we show our love to Jesus.

So what can we learn about sharing a cup of cold water? Let the love that God has for you and me reflect in your actions. We can show God's love for us through our actions. You are important and God showed just how important you are with the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross. We can serve by accepting that Jesus served us first. Jesus was a servant and we can reflect that in our own actions. Just as our God first loved us and demonstrated service through his Son Jesus, we too can show that love in simple acts of kindness. Accept freely the act of grace that God has bestowed upon you and freely share it with people around you. Amen.
