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Blessed

God of compassion and mercy, we give thanks that you journey with us into the future. Open us to the gifts of your presence and increase our willingness to follow as you lead. Turn our hearts to find their way home in you. Amen.

God is with us, even when we do not understand how or why. God continues to bless us to be a blessing to all Creation. Like Jacob, we are on an ongoing journey of grasping God's presence. Like the psalmist, we can celebrate how God knows us. With Paul and Jesus, we give thanks for our place in God's family.

Genesis 28:10–19a Jacob has proven to be self-interested and cunning, not a person for whom we would hold much affection. Once again, he has cheated Esau, this time out of their father's blessing (Genesis 27), the affirmation of Esau's inheritance. With the help of Rebekah, Jacob flees from home in order to avoid Esau's ire. He is en route to Haran, where he has family (Abraham and Sarah lived there before they set out on their journey), in the hope that he might find a wife and settle there. After putting as much distance as possible between himself and his brother, he settles down for the night. He rests his head on a stone and falls into a dream-filled sleep.

In the Hebrew scriptures, dreams were considered visions and messages from God. Jacob dreams of a ladder (or stairway or ramp) with angels ascending and descending between heaven and earth, a sign that this was a "thin place," a gateway between heaven and earth. While angels were often seen as God's messengers, these particular angels were not. They do not speak on God's behalf. God speaks directly to Jacob. God's promise to Abraham of land and a multitude of descendants is restated. Additionally, God promises to be with Jacob always and reassures him that he will return home one

day. The language used here is found elsewhere in Genesis (22:17; 26:2–3; 28:13) and identifies God as the same God who spoke with Isaac and Abraham, so Jacob inherits the promise given to his family. In contrast to how Jacob tricked Isaac into blessing him, God extends a generous gift of hope and blessing.

Waking up awestruck by the dream, Jacob takes the stone that has been his pillow, anoints it with oil, and forms an altar. He calls the place Bethel, House of God. He promises that as God is faithful to him, so he will be faithful to God.

The writer of **Psalm 139:1–12, 23–24** gives witness to God's hope and presence at all times. "You hem me in" (verse 5) uses a Hebrew verb that also can mean "protection" or "confinement." The psalmist rejoices that we are never beyond God's care.

Using words of hope and promise in **Romans 8:12–25**, Paul declares that God knows us and seeks us out to transform us into God's children. The trials and tribulations of all Creation will give birth to the time when all can recognize and claim this adoption.

One in a series of parables about the reign of God, Jesus' teaching in **Matthew 13:24–30**, **36–43** invites hope-filled trust in God. There is mystery in how God plants, nurtures, and weeds to secure a harvest of promise.

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
"I am with you," "I will keep you wherever you go," "I will not leave you" are the words that God speaks to Jacob in his dream. God speaks these same words to us. This week's texts ask us to consider what it means to know God and be known by God, as well as how this knowledge shapes how we live our lives. What other images do you have for your relationship with God?

Special Days Commentary

July 22 - St. Mary Magdalene

While the lists of which women first went to the tomb on Easter morning varies, in John's gospel, Mary Magdalene is commissioned as the first apostle of the risen Christ and is sent to tell the other disciples about the Resurrection. While the gospel of Luke tells us that Jesus healed her from an affliction, it is important to note that there is no evidence that she was a prostitute, as the church has too often portrayed.





July 25 - St. James the Apostle

The brothers James and John were mending their nets beside the Sea of Galilee along with their father Zebedee when Jesus called them to become disciples. Along with Simon Peter, they seem to have formed an inner circle of disciples. James and John argued about who got to sit on Jesus' left and right when he "came into glory."
