READING FROM THE HEBREW SCRIPTURES:

Exodus 32:1-14

When the people saw that Moses delayed to come down from the mountain, the people gathered around Aaron, and said to him, "Come, make gods for us, who shall go before us; as for this Moses, the man who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him." ²Aaron said to them, "Take off the gold rings that are on the ears of your wives, your sons, and your daughters, and bring them to me." ³So all the people took off the gold rings from their ears, and brought them to Aaron. ⁴He took the gold from them, formed it in a mould, and cast an image of a calf; and they said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" ⁵When Aaron saw this, he built an altar before it; and Aaron made proclamation and said, "Tomorrow shall be a festival to the Lord." ⁶They rose early the next day, and offered burnt offerings and brought sacrifices of well-being; and the people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to revel.

⁷The Lord said to Moses, "Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; ⁸they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshiped it and sacrificed to it, and said, 'These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!'" ⁹The Lord said to Moses, "I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. ¹⁰Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation." ¹¹But Moses implored the Lord his God, and said, "O Lord, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? ¹²Why should the Egyptians say, 'It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth'? Turn from your fierce wrath; change your mind and do not bring disaster on your people. ¹³Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, how you swore to them by your own self, saying to them, 'I will multiply your descendants like the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have promised I will give to your descendants, and they

shall inherit it forever.'" ¹⁴And the Lord changed his mind about the disaster that he planned to bring on his people.

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READINGS FROM THE CHRISTIAN SCRIPTURES:

Philippians 4:1-9

Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved. ²I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord. ³Yes, and I ask you also, my loyal companion, help these women, for they have struggled beside me in the work of the gospel, together with Clement and the rest of my co-workers, whose names are in the book of life. ⁴Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. ⁵Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. ⁶Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. ⁸Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. ⁹Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

Matthew 22:1-14

Once more Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying: ²"The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. ³He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. ⁴Again he sent other slaves, saying, 'Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my

dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet.' ⁵But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, ⁶while the rest seized his slaves, mistreated them, and killed them. ⁷The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. ⁸Then he said to his slaves, 'The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. ⁹Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet.' ¹⁰Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests. ¹¹"But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, ¹²and he said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?' And he was speechless. ¹³Then the king said to the attendants, 'Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' ¹⁴For many are called, but few are chosen."

REFLECTION:

Today we would like to look at one of the fruits of the Spirit in the Bible. Paul says in the book of Galatians that if we live by the Spirit, in another word, if we live as Christians or as followers of Jesus Christ, we bear some fruits of the Spirit. Do you know how many and what kind of fruits of the Spirit are mentioned? 9 fruits. Paul says in Galatians 5, "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the sinful nature with its passions and desires." This is very popular verses among Christians. This morning we will look at the third fruit of the Spirit which is peace.

Today, the world we live is no more peaceful world. People fear the war on terrorism. We have been watching the news this week and last week and have been overwhelmed with emotion at what is unfolding in Israel and the Palestinian territories. Already thousands of people have been killed. We know the war between Russia and Ukraine. Not only this, we also have experienced COVID. We fear natural disasters such as earthquake, hurricane, tsunami, and many other problems surrounded us. In these terrible events, we think and talk about peace. And we pray for peace. Today, many people in this world are committing suicide. The reasons of their suicide are worrying too much, depression, financial matters, and so on. I have thought about why they had to kill themselves. Couldn't they find any peace in their situations? What is peace? Where is peace? Where does peace come from?

I want my children to live in peace through their whole lives. Whenever I pray for my children, I pray for them to be a peace maker, happy maker, smile maker through their whole lives. God calls us to live in peace in this difficult world through our whole lives, and to live as peace makers in our congregation, our family, our community, and our world as Jesus came to the world as a peace maker. Then we need to ask, "What is peace"? If someone were to come and ask you, what is peace? How would you answer them? Peace is one of those things that everyone wants, but no one has a real clear answer of what it is or how you can get it and keep it. I like to look in the dictionary whenever I have a word that I need a clear understanding of. My electric dictionary has this to say about

peace: a situation or a period of time in which there is no war or violence in a country or an area, the state of being calm or quiet, the state of living in friendship with somebody without arguing, harmony, concord; an undisturbed state of mind, absence of mental conflict. All the explanations of peace that I have mentioned so far and probably many of the explanations of peace that you might give talk about peace as if it is something that happens when conflict and problems are not present. I have to get rid of all those things that create anxiety in my life in order for me to have peace. I have to get rid of my wife or my kids, or my friends or my neighbors or my bills. If this is so, then you will never have peace, because as long as you are alive, you will always have conflict, and you will always have problems. I want you to see today that peace comes not by getting rid of our problems but by focusing our thoughts on what God wants us to think about.

There once was a King who offered a prize to the artist who would paint the best picture of peace. Many artists tried. The King looked at all the pictures, but there were only two he really liked and he had to choose between them. One picture was of a calm lake. The lake was a perfect mirror for peaceful towering mountains were all around it. Overhead was a blue sky with fluffy white clouds. All who saw this picture thought that it was a perfect picture of peace. The other picture had mountains too. But these were rugged and bare. Above was an angry sky from which rain fell, and in which lightening played. Down the side of the mountain tumbled a foaming waterfall. This did not look peaceful at all. But when the King looked, he saw behind the waterfall a tiny bush growing in a crack in the rock. In the bush a mother bird had built her nest. There, in the midst of the rush of angry water, sat the mother bird on her nest perfect peace. Which picture do you think won the prize? The King chose the second picture. Do you know why? "Because," explained the King, "peace does not mean to be in a place where there is no noise, trouble, or hard work. Peace means to be in the midst of all those things and still be calm in your heart. That is the real meaning of peace." Peace doesn't come with the absence of the storm; it comes in the presence of the storm because Jesus is walking there beside us, and we have got our eyes on him.

In Paul's letter to the Philippians, we find one of the most popular benedictions in the church. Chapter 4 verse 7 says, "And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Then in verse nine, Paul inverts two of the important words in that benediction. Instead of saying "the peace of God," he says, "And the God of peace will be with you." The peace of God comes when we know the God of peace. We exchange a sign of peace with others every Sunday in our worship in saying "The peace of the Lord be always with you" or simply "Peace be with you". The world cannot give you nor teach you how to experience this true Divine peace. You can chant, do yoga, practice your bio-rhythms, take a drink, listen to your meditation music, consume your herbs, burn your aromatic candles and you will not find the inward tranquillity that God can give. The world can't understand it. The world can't supply it nor can you find it in yourself. It comes from God alone. In order to experience the peace from God, we shouldn't worry about anything. In our Philippians reading today in verse 6, Paul begins by commanding – "Don't worry about anything." You know this verse is what God has been saying to me over the past few months. I worried about my health every

day. What do I do now? What if my health gets worse? What about my family and children? What is my future? God kept talking to me, "Don't worry about anything." We are not to have anxiety. We are not to have worry. We are not to have nervousness. We are not to have fretfulness and fear. No matter what our situation or circumstances, there is no need to be anxious. Thus, we are not to be anxious. Instead of worrying, look at the Lord your God, the peace of God who besides you, who wants to give you peace that the world cannot give and understand.

So what can we do if we are in worry situation. Paul says that we are supposed to first pray. Whatever is bothering us, we need to take it to the Lord in prayer. Whatever we are facing that gives us cause for mental or emotional turmoil or distress, we need to bring it to the Lord's attention. That's what I did when I was weak and in times of trouble over the past few months. I Prayed and remembered your prayer. Praying is simply talking to God about what you think of him, what's going on in your life. It is your means of taking those things that cause you anxiety and worry and placing them at the foot of God. Then he talks about supplication or petition. That's where you ask God to do something in your life and in your situation. The Bible says in Romans, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord. When you are wrapped up in the arms of Jesus, and you know that you have an allpowerful God who hears your prayers and is in control of every situation, that's when you can have real peace.

I can't forget the conversation that I had with one of my friends around 20 years ago when I was in really difficult situation. I shared it with him and he said, "Isn't it so exciting that how God will work in your difficult situation?" Yes, it is so exciting because I believe God is beside me and definitely will do something which is best for me.

Brothers and sisters! Rejoice in the Lord, and give thanks to God for he has done for you and for he will do for you even in your difficult situations. Human beings cannot provide the peace that you need, only God can provide it for you.
