BIBLE READINGS

Luke 1: 26-38

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God." Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

REFLECTION

God of love and power, you are revealed to us in your Word, in accounts of prophecy and fulfillment that direct our attention to Jesus Christ. Illumine us now as we hear your Word proclaimed, that we may open our hearts to him, yearn for his coming in glory, and serve him with joy. Amen.

In a Christmas cartoon I came across in a magazine, a little child called Billy is wandering through various stores in a kind of family circus. Billy sees lots of signs that say "Don't forget Christmas Candy; don't forget wrapping paper, don't forget to visit Santa, don't forget last minute gifts", and so on. Then, Billy goes home and sits in front of his diary trying to describe what he has seen on that Christmas day. He keeps thinking and thinking and feels something is missing. So, he draws a picture of Mary, Joseph and baby Jesus and the star and writes on it "Don't forget" Well, I guess Billy really got his Christmas right. In the middle of many events happening to celebrate our Christmas, we, too, are to keep thinking and asking ourselves, "Where is Christmas to be found?"

Among the many images of Christmas, the nativity scene is one of the most familiar ones you can see. At one time the scene was the most common thing to find on a Christmas card, and of course every school play, or Sunday school presentation, had its moment when three or four shepherds dressed in bath robes, some wisemen with foil crowns, and a few children dressed up as sheep, and donkeys, and cows would gather around a young Mary and Joseph and gaze at a little bundle laying in a small pile of straw in a small manger. There is a feeling of warmth and peace to that scene, which normally summarizes the essence of Christmas to many people. To many, the scene is where their Christmas is to be found. However, this doesn't appear to be the case with our world any more.

I guess that some of you have watched a film or video called 'Santa Clause'. The Santa Clause I & II & III, those films were not quite a success in the film industry this world but they were one of the few best-selling Disney movies in the video industry. Tens of thousands of copies have been being sold every month throughout the world. Tim Allen, the Santa character in that film, is a divorced father of a child. Tim is chosen to be the Santa Clause by the land of mystery in the North Pole. Lots of fun stories are in the films, telling the spirit of Christmas as 'sharing and caring'. The movies were full of imaginative, fun stories relating Santa and his origin, huge Christmas presents factory hidden somewhere in the North Pole, which is run by hundreds of little elves, and even tooth fairy. If you watch the movies, you'll find yourselves very much wanting to believe in things like elf, tooth fairy and Santa Clause and his reindeers. Such a beautiful, touching Christmas story treating every single child in such a precious way. Santa risks everything in his life, just fulfilling his sacred obligations as the bearer of Christmas gifts to children around the world.

I thoroughly enjoyed the videos. However, when the movies were finished, I found myself coming back to my reality with a question: "Where is our Christmas to be found?" The movies, Santa Cause I and II don't mention a thing, a single thing about baby Christ, Mary or Joseph at all. I might sound like throwing cold water on this exciting Christmas atmosphere but I think we must ask ourselves and our families and friends, "Where is Christmas to be found?" What will our next generations and their next, and next generations be like, having grown up with all sorts of beautiful, touching stories about Christmas and its origin that have nothing to do with Christ and his birth? Where is their Christmas going to be found?

In those films, there always runs a sense of something magic, wonderful to be about to happen. Just before the birth of Jesus there was a similar sense of exciting expectation and hope. People were waiting and wondering. They felt like something wonderful was about to happen. The Scriptures had promised the coming of the Messiah, and rumors were widespread that he was coming at any time. He was going to turn the world around and deliver Israel from all her enemies of centuries. But if those same people, who were so high with expectation, had gone to a backyard stable in the town of Bethlehem one starry night, they might have said, That's it? Is that all? All that hype for this?? But actually, in this case, the reality was greater than the expectation. No one could have guessed how this child would change the world. No one could have imagined the impact he would have on world history and the change he would make in people's lives.

Mary was the first person in the world to carry the Gospel. What an enormous privilege was hers. She understood this privilege and worshiped God because of it. She sang in Luke chapter 1, "From now on all generations will call me blessed. (Luke 1:48)." Mark Lowry, a well-known hymn writer, puts the mystery to music in his song, 'Mary Did You Know?' The words go like this:

Mary, did you know that your baby boy would one day walk on water? Mary, did you know that your baby boy would save our sons and daughters? Did you know that your baby boy has come to make you new; and this child that you delivered will soon deliver you? Mary, did you know that your baby boy would give sight to the blind man? Mary, did you know that your baby boy would calm a storm with his hand? Did you know that your baby boy has walked where angels trod? And, when you kissed your little baby you've kissed the face of God? Oh, Mary, did you know? Mary, did you know? So long ago? Jesus was born in a world in which tyranny ruled everywhere, and poverty and hunger and suffering were overwhelming everywhere. There was no hope, no vision, even no reason to move on. And when you look at the time of Jesus realistically you might easily think that it was so foolish of Mary when she sang for joy to God as she did in today passage in Luke's gospel. What was there to celebrate in Judea 2000 years ago? And what today, here in this small global village too? Where 60 % of the world population is so poor, going through everyday struggles to get food for their families; 40 % has to live their next month without a job, and millions of children under six suffer and die of malnutrition or diseases like AIDS every six months. What about us here in Australia? People we love get sick and die, the jobs and the security of those around us in our lives are continually threatened, our children's futures are uncertain, and the numbers of teenagers' suicide is increasing every year. What is here to celebrate Christmas? I mean, real Christmas.

Mary was the first person in the world to carry the Gospel and she celebrated the good news by singing and living it. The exactly same thing is applied to us. Every single individual Christian must sing the same song that Mary did two thousand years ago. Every individual Christian is the person to carry the Gospel in this world. Gospel always has to be a good news to those who hear it. The same Spirit that was working in Mary and her life is still today with us and among us. The same person to whom Mary sang two thousand years ago is still alive with us and all humanity in the world. And, dear friends, this is where our Christmas is to be found. Jesus Christ is our song; he is our vision; he is our reason to live; he is our Christmas. Amen.

SHOWING LOVE TO THE MOST VULNERABLE

Sisters Srinidhi and Mahira are Sri Lankan refugees who have been living in refugee camps in India for decades. Like many refugees from Sri Lanka, they were forced to flee due to the conflict and violence in their home country. They are both widows who lost their husbands while in India and after all these years, they have never lived apart. Despite being independent, travelling outside the camp to the nearest hospital is too difficult, particularly with Mahira's health problems. Srinidhi explained, "Can't you see my sister? She can't even walk, how is she going to go to the hospital? That's why we want the hospital to come to us, the health workers to come to us. She comes and sees me regularly." Fortunately, Act for Peace's local partner in India, Organization for Eelam Refugees Rehabilitation, which is run by refugees themselves, have been providing crucial support and assistance in the camps for four decades.
