Word for the Day

It can be disheartening to see our churches getting smaller and older and fewer in number. We can take encouragement from Paul's letter here that this is not all our fault. This doesn't let us off the hook entirely. Paul still encourages his readers to spread the message, to be bearers of light. The way that this can be done is when our lives are filled with light. We may do this by practising gratitude for the good things we have, doing good deeds for those around us, and being a community of love that welcomes all different sorts of people.

It is important at this time to be sensitive to those among who might struggle with their mental and physical health or those who are grieving and who may not feel as if their lives are filled with light. Their feelings and experiences are valid parts of life.

Ideas for Reflection

• What are we grateful for today?

• How does it feel when the sun is shining down on us? Are there times when we avoid the sun? Are there people in our lives who make us feel like the sun is shining on us? What are the things they do that make us feel like that?

• How might we shine a light in our community? How can we serve each other? How can we serve others outside of our faith community? How might we let people know that God loves them?

Today's Scriptures Isaiah 40:21–31

The writer reminds the Israelites that the wonders of creation are far beyond the understanding of mere humans. God's power uplifts those who meditate on God.

Psalm 147:1–11, 20c encourages the hearer to remember that Creator God takes care of Creation, including people who are broken- hearted, outcast and downtrodden.



1 Corinthians 9:16–23

Paul writes that he makes sure he fits in with the communities he visits in order to proclaim the gospel.

Mark 1:29-39

Jesus heals many people, including Simon's mother-in-law, who is not named, and says to his followers, 'This is why I've come.'
