Word for the Day

The Bible reading for the first week of Lent usually focuses on Jesus's time in the wilderness. This time is generally understood as a period of preparation for the ministry of healing and teaching that follows. Often, we think of this time as being solitary, except for the company of the one who is testing or tempting Jesus, which usually understood as a reflection on Jesus's intentional choice to accept his calling. These are important and helpful observations. However, the story recounted in the gospel of Mark also highlights the company that Jesus has in the wilderness place. The text describes him as accompanied by wild animals and with angels waiting upon him. In the wilderness, Jesus is not alone, but sometimes we skip over these other-than-human companions. What happens when we notice the presence of the wild beasts and the angels? How might this observation shift our understanding of who Jesus comes to proclaim God's presence and love to? How might we broaden our own understandings of living in God's ways to include the non-human around us?

Ideas for Reflection

- What do you think it was like for Jesus to be in the wilderness?
- How might Jesus have responded to the presence of the wild beasts and angels?
- When, where, and how do you feel the companionship of the otherthan-human?
- How might connecting to the other-than-human help us to walk in Christ's ways?

Ash Wednesday

Scriptures

Genesis 9:8–17

In the wake of the flood, God makes a covenant with Noah, Noah's family, and with every living creature. The promise is that God will not bring a great flood again. The sign of God's promise is the rainbow.

Psalm 25:1–10 is attributed to David who asks for God's mercy and instruction. The psalmist identifies God's instruction in living well as an element of God's goodness and love.

1 Peter 3:18-22

This curious and challenging passage from among the earliest Christian communities links the grace experienced in baptism with the story of God saving Noah and his family from the waters of the flood.

Mark 1:9-15

Jesus' ministry begins with baptism, followed immediately by time in the wilderness. After these rites of passage, Jesus proclaims the Good News of God's presence and calls on those who hear him to turn their lives around to live in God's ways.

Lent Bible Studies Going Deeper

The Assembly Circles of Interest will be sharing a Lenten Bible Study series over the 7 weeks leading up Easter using the theme "Going Deeper".

The studies will encourage us to 'go deeper' into our relationship with God, our community and our world.

Each week, a different Circle will share a reflection based on one of the Lectionary readings for the coming Sunday offered through the lens of that particular Circle.
