Word for the Day

Jesus causes a ruckus in the temple. While this event occurs towards the end of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, it is found at the beginning of Jesus' ministry here in John. Jesus will confront and create conflict. This might be experienced as concerning, exciting, hopeful, discomforting... depending on where those who encounter him are already located. Interestingly, this passage demonstrates how the community of disciples made sense of their time with Jesus. As they looked back on what he did and said, they drew meaning from the scriptures they knew to make sense of the things that Jesus said and did, creating new ways to interpret. We might

add to our discussion the words of Paul to the church in Corinth. Paul argues that the cross is a strange place to locate the activity of God, a place that he sees as being counter to the expectations of both the Greek and Jewish communities he is familiar with. Paul's words suggest that we shouldn't get too comfortable with what we think we know about where we will encounter God. If God is at work in the places that are seen as not good enough, this might challenge us to think about where the gospel is being embodied today. Professor Anne Pattel-Gray is a descendant of the Bidjara / Kari Kari people. She calls out the ongoing racism and colonialism that she sees in the church in Australia (which is similarly offered by Indigenous theologians in other places around the world). Her sharp critique is of the kinds of theology that many may be accustomed to, the 'wisdom' that has come from traditional Western biblical interpretation and that positions itself as superior to other thinking about God. She suggests that God is presented by much Western theology 'as a disembodied deity uninterested in earthly affairs, inherently stripping the earth and nature of any spiritual significance or meaning.' She notes that this disembodiment of God, the separation of God from creation is unthinkable for First Nations peoples.¹

The passages we read today both point to God being present in places and ways that surprised the writers. Are we willing to be surprised, even if it challenges the things we assume that we already know about God? How will this lead us to follow Jesus in his movement towards a more just community?

Ideas for Reflection

What surprises or shocks you in today's readings? How do you respond to Professor Anne Pattel-Gray's insights? Where today might Jesus' disciples learn the kind of wisdom that Paul alludes to in his letter to the Corinthians?
