## **Scriptures**

#### 2 Samuel 11:26—12:13a

God is displeased by David's actions in taking Bathsheba as his wife. Nathan confronts and condemns David regarding his behaviour.

#### Psalm 51:1-12

A psalm of lament and repentance calling on God to cleanse the psalmist's heart.

#### Ephesians 4:1-16

Paul urges the Ephesians to live a life of humility, gentleness, and patience in order to live in unity in the body of Christ.

#### John 6:24-35

In response to a conversation about what God requires, Jesus declares he is the bread of life.

#### **Theme Focus**

As Jesus challenges the crowd who followed after the miraculous feeding, seeking more of the same, and declares that he is the Bread of Life in whom they will find true nourishment, we reflect on how God nurtures and nourishes us.

## **Word for the Day**

This week's reading from the gospel of John follows on from last week's feeding of the crowd. The people continue to follow Jesus and his disciples, seeking healing and nourishment. Jesus challenges the people. They have only come because they were fed and want to fill their bellies again. Jesus shifts their thinking from the physical to the spiritual. He challenges them to think not only about their physical food but also about what will nourish them for eternity.

Jesus refers the people to the story of the manna in the wilderness (Exodus 16:1–36) of which they would have been familiar. As Jesus explains, this bread came from God and is the real bread that continues nourishing. The people ask Jesus to give them this bread.

Jesus replies, telling the people that he is the bread of life and anyone who comes to him will hunger and thirst no more. This adds to John's gospel's other great 'I am' statements. Living Water, Light, Life, Shepherd – Bread adds to the list of metaphors used to describe who Jesus is. Jesus is the one who nourishes and feeds the people.

#### **Ideas for Reflection**

This section of the narrative of John 6 presses the point that a sign or miracle from Jesus is not enough. Jesus embodies transformation, and the 'I am' statements symbolise this. Not only does Jesus physically feed the people, but he also feeds them spiritually. Exploring the metaphors further by asking how bread is and is not like Jesus may be helpful.

You are invited to reflect on when God has nurtured you in your lives.

It may also be helpful to revisit the story from Exodus 16 to make connections between the Hebrew Scriptures and Jesus' proclamation here. How is Jesus the Bread from Heaven for the people in the crowd?

#### Poetry as a contemplative practice

#### Instructions

- 1. Try to let your mind drop into your heart as you quietly read or listen to the poem. You might like to start by centring on your breath.
- 2. Read or listen to the poem through more than one time.
- 3. Notice what arises in you each time.

This activity is a way of entering into the scriptural themes in a contemplative way – not unlike how one might engage in a *lectio divina* process.

(From our song files)

Crowded table, urgent faces, people longing for the bread, bread of life and bread for living, bread for rising from the dead.
