## **Scriptures**

**1 Samuel 1:4–20** tells the story of Samuel's mother, Hannah, who experienced difficulty conceiving a child. From her place of sorrow, Hannah prays to God in the temple. When she bears the child, Hannah names him Samuel, which means 'God has heard.'

#### 1 Samuel 2:1-10

Instead of a psalm today, we read Hannah's song of prayer and praise. The words resonate with those Mary sings in the Magnificat: 'My heart rejoices in the LORD.'

#### Hebrews 10:11-14, (15-18), 19-25

This text again continues the reflection from previous weeks, likening the work of Jesus to the work of both the priests *and* the sacrifice in the sacrificial system. The writer uses images from a sacrificial offering to encourage the community that through this work of Christ, his followers have no barrier between themselves and God.

#### Mark 13:1-8

This passage begins as the disciples comment on the grandeur of the temple. Jesus states that the temple will not last forever. The disciples want to understand all the details: the when and the how. Jesus does not answer the question but instead cautions them to watch out and to pay attention as they follow after him.

## **Theme Focus**

As we move toward the end of the Church year and Reign of Christ Sunday, we hear Hannah sing of a justice-seeking God who turns things upside down, listen as Jesus speaks of the vastness of God's actions and the surprising presence of God, and look to what lasts.

### Word for the Day

Don't you think it would have been infuriating at times to be one of the disciples?

They ask questions, but Jesus doesn't really answer. In Mark 13:1–8, we have Jesus twice responding but not responding to the comments or questions from his disciples.

Firstly, we have a strange comment from one disciple about the temple. The preceding passage (which some may have read last week) focused on God noticing the poor, the widow. Then, in this passage, the disciple notes the greatness of the temple. There is a disjunction here. When Jesus responds, it is to say that the great stones would not last forever. (And some see in this comment a writing context for Mark, around the time of the temple's destruction by the Roman army in 70 C.E.)

Then, we have some disciples wanting to understand what Jesus is saying, to get into the nuts and bolts of when the stones would be thrown down, and to understand how they could get their heads around understanding everything. Again, Jesus doesn't really answer them. He speaks instead about keeping watch and being aware in all times and contexts so that they might keep walking in God's ways (These verses begin a longer passage known as the little apocalypse, which we usually read at the beginning of Advent.)

Jesus won't box God in. In his responses to the disciples, Jesus points to the vastness of God's action. What is needed from the disciples is not anxiety or exact understanding about times and places, but rather a posture of attention toward the world and toward the surprising presence of God who just might show up within it.

## **Ideas for Reflection**

- Imagine you are one of the disciples in this reading. How would you respond to Jesus? What questions would you have?
- What does it mean to pay attention? How do we pay attention to the world? And to God?
- How do you respond to the idea that we cannot box God in? Do you find this comforting? challenging? dangerous?
