Scriptures from the Revised Common Lectionary

Jeremiah 23:1-6

God denounces those who are destroying and scattering the flock of God. God promises to raise up a new shepherd who will tend the flock in a just and wise way.

Luke 1:68-79

Zechariah and Elizabeth bring their son to be circumcised and name him John. At this point, Zechariah, who has been unable to speak, sings a song of praise to God for his son, who will become a prophet.

Colossians 1:11-20

Christ is placed above all things and before all things and will rule over the powers of darkness bringing redemption to all people

Luke 23:33-43

The mocking and crucifixion of Jesus. A notice proclaiming Jesus as 'The King of the Jews' is placed above him. The criminal to Jesus' side asks him to remember him when he comes into his kingdom.

Theme Focus

On this Sunday, often referred to as Christ the King, we explore what Christ's reign means for the world today.

Word for the Day

Jeremiah 23:1–6 acknowledges that leaders can be destructive and divisive. This is very familiar to us in today's world. We see in our news every week the consequences of unjust leadership on the vulnerable people of the world. The prophet proclaims that God will raise up new leaders and new shepherds who will lead in a different way. We see this manifested in the person of Jesus.

Luke 23:33–43 takes us to the story of Jesus' crucifixion just weeks before we celebrate his birth. This may seem unusual, but it reminds us of the counter-cultural nature of Jesus' message and leadership. While on the cross, humiliated and without power, Jesus continues to show love and compassion to those he encounters. This 'reign' is not of a kingdom that has power over people, but of a kin-dom that lives amongst and with all people. Those who may be oppressed and marginalised by unjust power are seen, heard and loved in Christ's kindom.

Ideas for Reflection

How do you see the counter-cultural kin-dom being expressed in your faith community?

What are the challenges of this 'reign' of Jesus as opposed to what we view in leadership of the world?

What does being part of the kin-dom of Christ mean for you, individually, and for your community, and our world?

November 23, Reign of Christ – Proper 29
Readings: Jeremiah 23:1-6 and Luke 1:68-79, Jeremiah 23:1-6 and Psalm
46, Colossians 1:11-20, Luke 23:33-43

The final Sunday of the church's year is often referred to the festival of "Christ the King". Yet, while the scriptures of the New Testament consistently affirm that Christ is sovereign, what exactly this means is not quite as clear. It is no surprise that the readings for today offer several options.

In <u>Jeremiah 23</u>, the 'righteous branch of David shall reign as a King', but he rules like a shepherd caring for sheep. In Luke 1, the promised saviour is much more the ultimate prophet in the traditions of old, calling the people away from sin and showing the glory of God, shining like the dawn's light.

<u>Psalm 46</u> speaks of refuge and safety, possibly implying that the king will be a strong protector, and in <u>Colossians 1</u> we see a fully realised incarnation and Jesus is not simply a king, but the ultimate sovereign God present in and around and through all creation.

Finally, in <u>Luke 23</u>, we read that our Lord is a broken man, dying on a cross and yet still overflowing with mercy. It is hard to hold all these images together all at once and in each moment, I don't think we are meant to. However, if we are to proclaim Jesus as sovereign of all creation, let us also remember that he is a king like no other, and he will keep surprising us with his power, grace and love. Not a bad place to finish the year!
