Scriptures

Micah 6:1–8

God speaks to the people through the prophet Micah, reminding them of God's faithfulness. In return, God requires them to do justice, love one another, and walk humbly with God.

Psalms 15

The psalmist says that only the most blameless person will be allowed to dwell on God's holy mountain.

1 Corinthians 1:18–31

Paul explains how human wisdom fails to understand the message of the cross, and that God upends human understanding so that people can only come to God through God's grace.

Matthew 5:1–12

Often called the Beatitudes, this passage from Matthew outlines the blessings and happiness that are derived not from worldly wealth and success, but through the gifts of God.

Theme Focus

We listen to Micah's call and Jesus' blessings for the humble and hopeful and are invited to consider how we act toward justice, practice loving kindness, and walk humbly with God.

Word for the Day

This is another familiar passage, at least verse 8, but how often do we hear it in context?

YHWH is bringing a lawsuit against YHWH's people. The language of lawsuits or ribs is relatively common in the Hebrew Bible, although it is often not made this explicit. The psalmist often brings a rib against YHWH, challenging YHWH to listen to their plea. The prophets also frequently use this framework to alert the Israelites to the error of their ways.

Here, YHWH reminds the people of their rescue from Egypt, and from Moab and other enemies. Therefore, the requirement to do justice, embrace loving-kindness and walk humbly with God is done in response to what God has done for them.

Ideas for Reflection

- This passage, along with others like it, invites us to dialogue with God. If you were to have a conversation with God, what might you say? What do you think God would say?
- In vv. 6 and 7, various Israelite worship practices are described. While these are very different from our own, what practices might God detest in our worship? (*Hint: it is not so much the specific actions, but the way they shift our focus from God's requirements*)
- Research Micah Challenge (<https://www.micahaustralia.org/>) and consider how you may like to get involved.
- When we read the Beatitudes alongside Micah's words, what picture of God's reign begins to emerge?

The promised Comforter, alive and free,

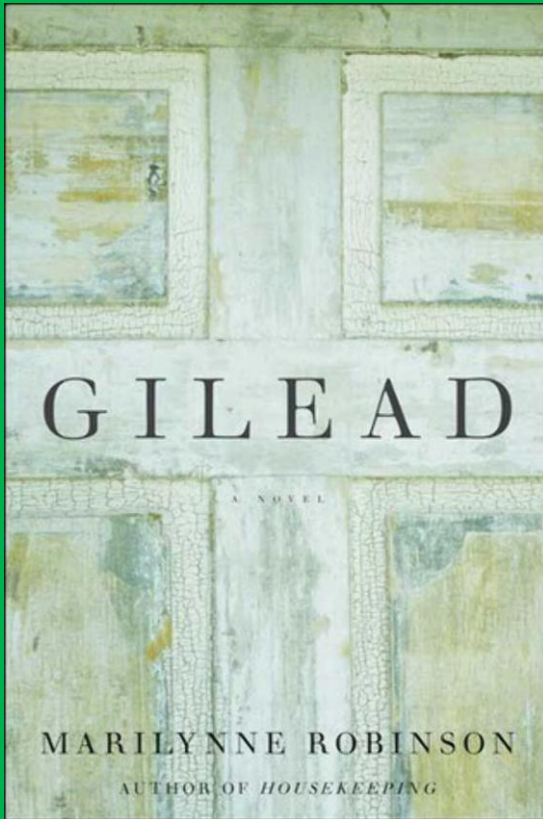
The kingdom coming and the Son returning,

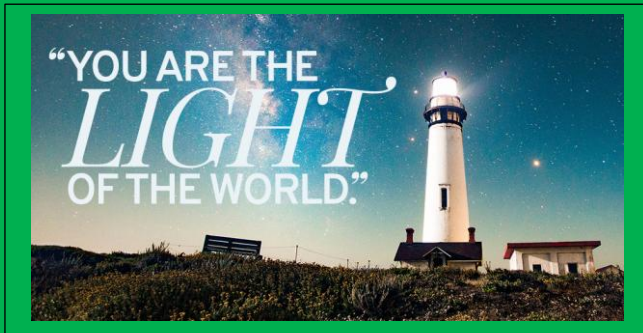
